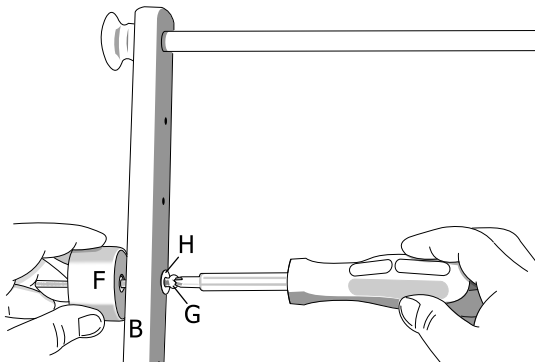
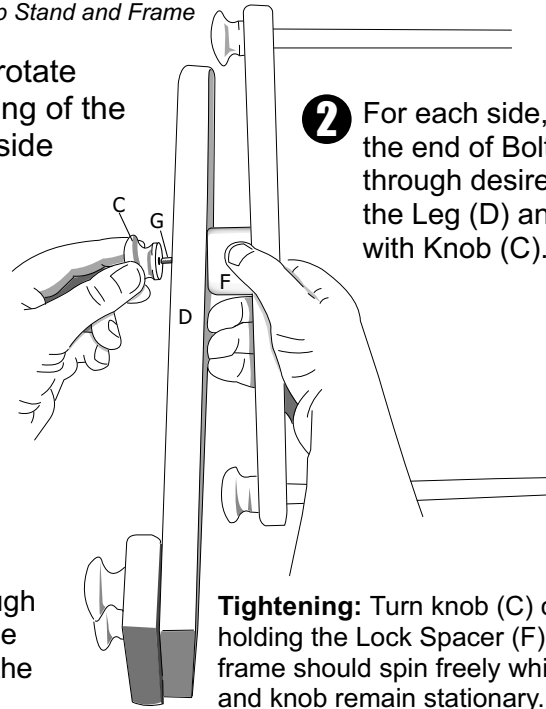


New Lock Spacers For Tomorrow's Treasures Lap Stand and Frame

The new Lock Spacers allow the scroll frame to rotate independently of the stand. This reduces loosening of the outside knobs when rotating the frame for underside viewing.



- 1** On each side, insert the Bolt (G) through the Washer (H), center hole of the Side Bar (B), and threaded metal insert of the Lock Spacer (F). Use a phillips screwdriver to tighten the bolt so the Lock Spacer (F) is flush with the Side Bar (B). Do not over-tighten. Leave loose enough for Sidebar (B) to rotate.



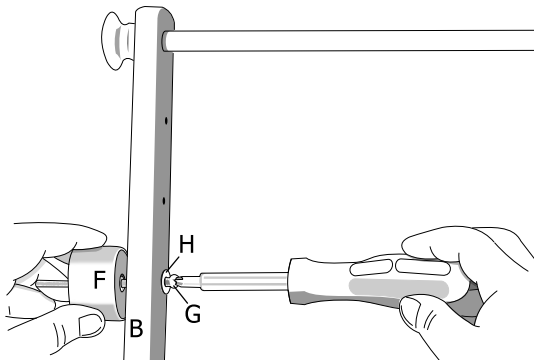
- 2** For each side, insert the end of Bolt (G) through desired hole in the Leg (D) and fasten with Knob (C).

Tightening: Turn knob (C) clockwise while holding the Lock Spacer (F) stationary. The scroll frame should spin freely while the lock spacer and knob remain stationary. If the spacer, bolt, or knob rotate with the frame then tighten a bit more. When properly tightened, it's normal for the lapstand to have a little "give" to rotate the frame as needed.

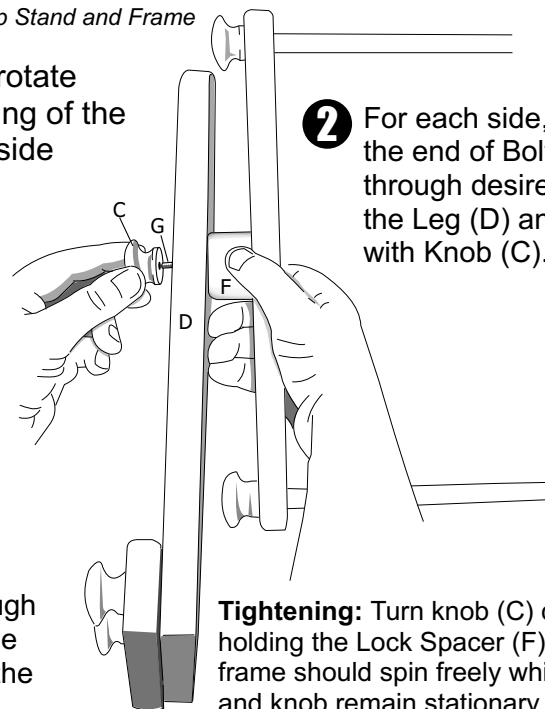
